A retired graphic design artist is considering exhibiting at this time also.

Goodwill Day Hab CR will exhibit in August on the school exhibit wall and will have a daytime reception.

Picnic in the Prairie Fall Concert

The Picnic on the Prairie Fall Concert will be Saturday, August 19. The performers for the concert consists of the group of Natalie Brown, Carlis Faurot, Mike Maas, Ben Soltau, and John O'Connell. It will cost \$1,000 for the entertainment and no port-a-pots are needed for this event. The council decided to have 2 off duty security officers for the event.
