Staff has located a basic blue Chevrolet Silverado 1500 pickup truck with an eight foot bed, regular cab, with 4-wheel drive. Unfortunately it is in Buffalo, Minnesota. It will cost \$885 to have it deliver to Marion. The issue I have with the purchase price is they are charging \$2,759 for title and paper work which is very excessive. The last truck we bought only charged \$125 and I handled the title and registration of the vehicle with lowa DOT. I will continue research this charge and to see if they will lower this cost next week before the board meeting. There is a state bid for a Ford F-150 for \$41,421 but it could take 6 months or more to build and deliver. The Chevy truck cost is \$45,240. There is not an immediate need for a truck right now but since we are unable to place an order for the new serviceman's truck right now due to supply chain issues, staff was thinking of getting a regular pickup truck now instead of getting three trucks next fiscal year.
